NOBLE Expresses Concern Over the Termination of Jerel Jones, Chief of Police, Flossmoor, Illinois

Alexandria, Va. – March 10, 2024 – The National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE) expresses concern over the recent termination of Jerel Jones, Chief of Police, Flossmoor, Illinois. NOBLE joins its Chicago Metropolitan Chapter as we collectively lend our support to Chief Jerel Jones.

In reviewing the totality of the publicly available information, it is very alarming that in a matter of months the administration determined that Chief Jones made “serious lapses in performance” that rose to the level of severing his relationship with the community. It appears to us that members of the Flossmoor community share these same concerns. NOBLE stands in support of Chief Jerel Jones to ensure that his character and professional integrity are not the casualty of allegations and decisions made by Flossmoor’s administration.

Again, NOBLE stands firmly in support of Chief Jones as we witness the unwavering backing of the community and his professional peers. Chief Jones has demonstrated exceptional leadership, integrity, and dedication in his role as a law enforcement executive.
